Sports Premium Funding Annual Statement: 2022 - 2023

St Mary's believe that sport is an integral part of the curriculum and we provide a wide range of curricular and extracurricular activities. With the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding to improve the provision of P.E. and sport in primary schools we are committed to developing high quality P.E. lessons, alongside opportunities for competitive sport and clubs.

The Primary School Sports Funding is additional government funding to directly improve P.E. and sports provision. The use of this money will be assessed as part of the Ofsted judgement on the quality of the school's Leadership and Management.

The overall aim of the funding is to promote the development of healthy and active lifestyles. It also aims to promote more traditional sports by improving the quality and provision in primary schools.

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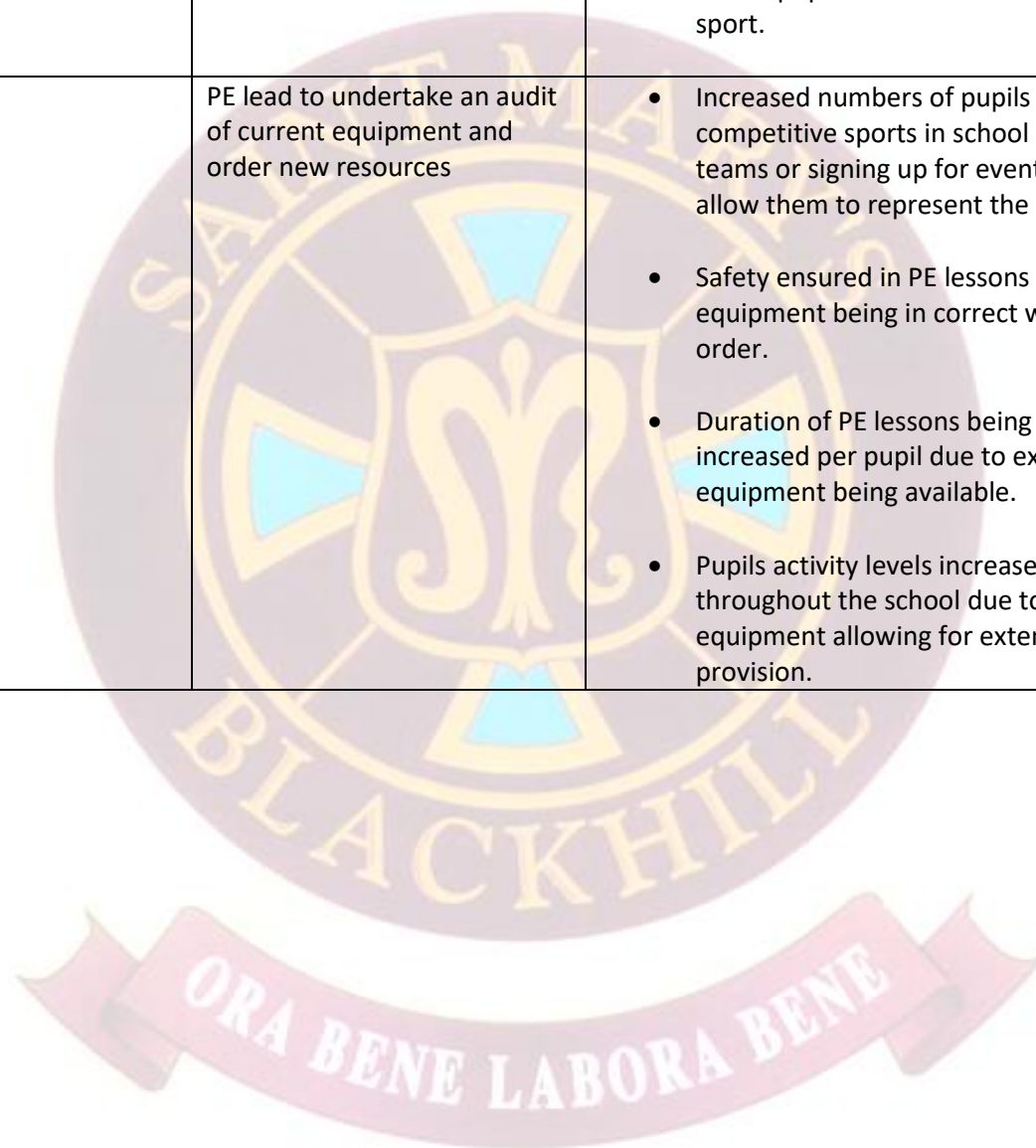

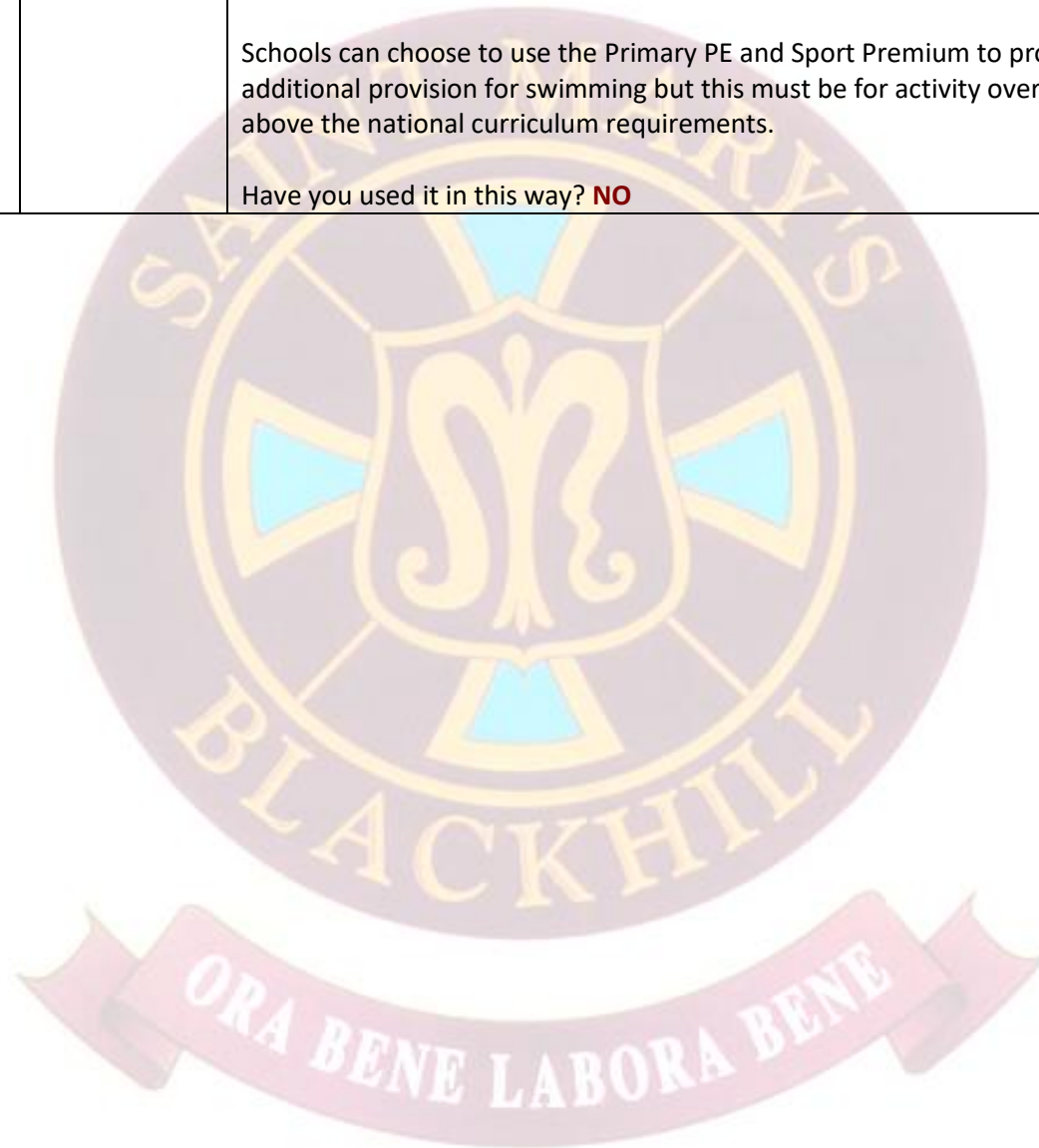
