## Books Home – Feedback Policy/Live marking

We hope that you have enjoyed receiving your child's workbooks this week to see how much progress they have made from September to July. The way teachers mark children's work has changed a lot since some of us were at school. These changes are based on up to date research, which indicates that the best form of marking and feedback is carried out 'in the moment' often referred to as 'live' feedback. The majority of feedback teachers use at St Mary's is verbal feedback, ideally while learning and work is still being completed. Therefore, you may not see the old fashioned 'ticks' 'crosses' 'corrections' etc in red pen. If this has left you puzzled or concerned or if you feel you would like more information, we would appreciate it if you would contact the school office and request a copy of our feedback policy, before raising your concerns with individual staff.

## End of Year Reports

Thank you so much to those parents who gave us positive feedback about the new format for our end of year reports. Understandably, as with any change, we also received some questions from parents querying why the teacher comments section was slimmed down. Again, understandably, parents want the best for their children, and many of you want to know what you can do to support your children more at home. This was the reason why the old way of writing reports included 'areas for improvement / next steps'. However, the curriculum at St Mary's has changed very quickly, over a short period of time. Staff have received specialised training on how to teach Power Maths; Read Write Inc; Opening Worlds Humanities; HEP Science; Fresh Start Interventions; Read Write Inc. Spelling etc. And for this reason, we have not included a target for each child in every curriculum area as it would be incredibly unfair to expect parents to teach their children at home. In some cases, this can lead to children unintentionally being taught the wrong things. The most effective and powerful way parents can support their child's progress at home is to encourage a love of reading by making sure they listen to their child read every day (even in Key Stage 2) and support them to develop basic skills in number fluency, e.g. number bonds; times-tables; number bonds to 10, 20, 100 etc. This is one of many reasons why we made the decision to change the homework at the beginning of the Summer term.
